Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) – (Version – 1)

Computer Based Test (CBT) for R22 Regulations	
1	Is Computer Based Test (CBT) option is available in R22 Regulations?
Ans	Yes. It is introduced as an amendment in R22 Regulation. It is provided only for the students who got less than 14 Marks in continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) which makes the student in-eligible to semester end examination (SEE) in R-22 regulations. If a student, gets 14 or more marks in CBT, such students need not re- register the course along with the next junior batch but shall be permitted to appear for University Examinations. 2	A student who got minimum required marks in CBT, when does the student appear for the SEE?
Ans	As the time gap between the finalisation of internal marks and commencement of SEE for the regular batch is very less, conducting CBT may not be feasible. Hence CBT may be conducted immediately after the regular SEE and the students who got minimum required marks in CBT may be permitted to appear for the supplementary series examination. Such students need not register along with their junior batch.
3	Whether the CBT provision is there for the already completed academic years / semesters in R-22 regulations?
Ans	Yes. The students who have not secured sufficient internal marks to get eligibility to write semester-end examination and subsequently not registered the same course with their juniors or registered but could not secure the minimum marks to get the eligibility for appearing semester end examinations, shall be allowed to appear for the CBT exam.
4	What if the student does not get the required minimum marks in CBT for becoming eligible to appear for SEE?
Ans	Such students shall have the following two options: 1) Register for this course along with the next batch students of the same branch or 2) writing the CBT once again when the notification is issued.
5	How the CBT exam of R-22 and R-25 regulations are different?
Ans	In R-25 regulations, the option of CBT is given for every student who wish to improve his/her internal marks and the average of best two out of three (two mid-term exams plus one CBT) shall be the final CIE marks. Other assessment components will remain the same. Where as in R-22 regulations, CBT provision is there only for the students, who could not score the minimum required marks and CBT exam shall be conducted for the marks that are equal to

	maximum marks allocated for CIE. Other assessment components shall not be taken into consideration.
6	Whether the CBT exam is to be conducted in descriptive mode?
Ans	No, this exam is to be conducted in MCQ pattern only. It is proposed to ensure avoiding any arbitrariness or human bias, while evaluating the answer scripts,
7	Whether the CBT exam is to be conducted as Computer Based Test or can be conducted in manual mode also?
Ans	Computer Based Test is preferred to ensure objectivity. However, if the number of candidates are very less or other logistic reasons, the exam may be conducted in manual mode also.

Online regular and advance course registration	
1	If a student is willing to complete the courses in advance, is the option available?
Ans	Yes. A student can select a maximum of two Courses along with the regular courses of current semester with the condition that these courses must be professional elective courses of the immediately following semester.
2	Is Advance Course Registration (ACR) is applicable only for the courses in IV-II semester?
Ans	No. Advance Course Registration is available for all semesters, only one semester advance, if the course pre-requisites are fulfilled by the student. The faculty mentors shall decide if the prerequisites are satisfied or not. For example, if the Professional Elective is offered in III-I semester, students can register for this course in online mode in II-II semester.
3	Whether the advance course registration is applicable for Core courses and Open Elective courses also?
Ans	No. Advance course registration is Applicable only for Professional electives. It is not applicable for Core Subjects and open electives.
4	If a student fails the online course opted under Advance Course Registration, will it be considered as supply or regular?
Ans	If a student fails in Advance Course Registration, it will not be counted as supply. However, if a student fails in online course belonging to the current semester, it will be treated as supplementary.
5	Suppose a student opted MOOCs course under Advance Course Registration and fails, what are the alternates?
Ans	If a student Opted an online course under Advance Course Registration and fails, the student has three options to choose from: Option 1: Register for the same MOOCs course, if offered next time Option 2: Register for another MOOCS course from the Board of Studies approved course under the same Professional Elective basket. Option 3: Register for the actual Professional Elective course offered at the department (Physical mode).
6	A Student completed the course in advance, what about the printing of grade Memo?
Ans	Though the student completes a course in advance, the grade of this course will be printed only in the grade memo of the semester in which this course is offered.
7	Under CBCS, one or two courses can be advanced or postponed. Is this rule still applicable? Now the advancement is proposed for a max of two PEs. Can the student avail both the provisions?
Ans	The student will be overloaded if he/she registers for two additional courses as per CBCS and register for two PEs in online mode. Hence it is proposed to keep a cap on two. Accordingly, the student can register for either two additional regular courses as per CBCS norms or two additional online PEs or one regular course

	and one PE course.
8	Can the student register for a Professional Electives course which is having a labs?
Ans	If the online learning platform provides theory teaching and simulated lab environment, then we will permit the students to register for both the theory and lab in the online mode. If such provision is not there the student shall be advised to register for PE and the associated lab in the conventional mode only. It is not recommended to have online course for theory and the corresponding lab as physical lab.

Minor and Honor Degree Programs	
1	Can a student discontinue the Minor or Honor degree program once opted?
Ans	Yes. In such case only B.Tech. degree will be issued.
2	If the student secured the required credits for the award of B.Tech. degree but having one or more backlogs in Minor, when can the student get his B.Tech. degree.
Ans	If the student wants B.Tech. degree immediately, he/she has to submit a declaration to the Principal stating that he/she will forego the credits earned for the Minor program and receive only B.Tech. degree. In such cases only B.Tech. degree will be issued. Alternatively, if the student wants both the B. Tech. and Minor degree, he/she can clear the backlog subjects in Minor program and get both the B.Tech. degree and Minor deg.
3	Can the courses under Minor / Honor Degree can be opted through MOOCs/ Online learning platforms?
Ans	A few online courses are permitted as per the Minors/Honors academic regulations.
4	What is the eligibility to offer Minor and Honor Degree Program
Ans	Honor Degree Program is department specific and can be offered only if the respective department has PG Program. However, the Minor Degree Program is interdisciplinary and the offering department need not have any PG Program. Any department in any college can offer minor degree course, if they have the expertise.
5	What is the Minimum number of students requirement to offer Minor and Honor Degree Program
Ans	The Principals of the colleges need to take the call.
6	Whether the University approval is required to offer Minors and Honors programs?
Ans	In R-22 regulations, the colleges need to take prior approval of the University. However, for R-25 academic regulation the colleges need to apply at the time of submitting their college application for the renewal of affiliation at AAC portal. When the University FFC committee visits the college, the facilities of the applied Minors and Honors courses need to be shown.
7	What are the department –wise minor courses recognised by the University?
Ans	The list of approved Minors, branch-wise have been made available in the University web-site. If any autonomous / non-autonomous college wishes to offer a new Minor, such colleges need to take the prior approval from the University.
