1. Introduction

The conduct of examinations, declaration of results and issuing of certificates are the important activities of the University. The Examination Section is the backbone of the University. It is of paramount importance that the examinations are conducted with most precision, fairness and objectivity to gain public credibility and esteem. In order to achieve this, all rules and procedures relating to the examinations should be so well delineated as to leave nothing to chance and assumption.

The present Examination system aims at guiding the effective, efficient and lawful conduct of University examinations comprising, Under Graduate (UG) and Post Graduate (PG) and Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) programmes. It also defines the roles, responsibilities of the people involved, protocols, procedures to be followed and various steps that have to be taken at all the levels associated with the conduct of the examinations under JNTUH. All the Forms/Proforma for use in the examination system and documentation have been drawn out in standardized formats. Measures to curb unfair means and malpractices have also been listed along with the penalty and punishments.

Evolve as a futuristic Examination system to ensure critical evaluation of large number of students with precision and integrity to gain public credibility and esteem.

- 1. Providing quick and accurate online services for students through Exam portal.
- 2. Identifying experienced subject experts for setting of question papers to evaluate higher order thinking skills of students.
- 3. Conduct the examinations as per the University norms to leave nothing to chance and assumption.
- 4. Complete the Evaluation and publish results in time according to the Time line.
- 5. Address students, college's queries and grievances immediately.

2. Innovative practices

2.1. Thin Client based central spot valuation

A Thin Client based software is developed in-house and maintained as a LAN application for Answer script valuation. The main objective of the Thin Client based software is to make the marks available in the server as soon as evaluator posts the marks on the screen, which freezes the marks in the database server completely preventing tampering of the marks. After valuation of the answer script, the Thin Client Based software will take care of totalling of marks, avoiding errors occurring during manual totalling. This resulted in drastic reduction in recounting applications. After the valuation, the scrutinizer will enter the marks posted in the script into the Thin Client. If any mismatch found between the marks posted by evaluator and scrutinizer, then that particular script is raised for scrutiny correction and will be rectified by the valuator.

2.2. Online Student Services portal

First Time JNTUH University, Hyderabad has initiated and established Online Student Services portal. This service portal helps the applicants to apply online and off-line services to receive the various certificates within a stipulated time (https://studentservices.jntuh.ac.in/os). Certificates include Transcripts, Provisional Certificates, Consolidated Marks Memos, Original Degree Certificates, English Medium Certificate, Migration Certificate, World Education Service (WES) application etc.

2.3. Grievance Cell

To resolve the critical issues of JNTUH students and college Principals timely an Online Grievance cell is established. Exam Branch has resolved more than thousand Grievances of students pertaining to Original Certificates, Duplicate Certificates, Transcripts, PCs, CMM, Registrations, and Payments etc.

3. Activities

3.1 Conduct of VII Convocation on 9th May 2018.

The University has conducted VII Convocation on 9th May 2018. His Excellency, Honourable Sri E.S.L.Narasimhan, Governor of Telangana, Chancellor of the University has graced the convocation. The University has issued conferment of Doctor of Philosophy (HonorisCausa) to Dr.V. Ramgopal Rao, Director, IIT Delhi and 54 gold medals were presented to the meritorious students. Further, the University has awarded the Degrees as shown in Table 1.

3.3. Allotment of Exam Centers for students

Students are jumbled cluster wise and mapped to host colleges for writing **University Semester End Examinations** without an undue advantage. Cluster based Jumbling Process is done with automation using In-house developed Software. In this Academic Year, 8,46,531 students appeared for UG Examinations in 480 host centers monitored by approximately 500 observers from cluster colleges and more than 130 special observers from University. In this Academic Year, 89404 students appeared for PG Examinations in 539 host centers monitored by approximately 550 observers from cluster colleges and more than 150 special observers from University.

After the results declaration within one week students can apply through online for re-counting / revaluation, if the student is not satisfied with the acquired results. Around 25% of total students applied for RC/RV and grade change is less than one percent for this academic year.

3.6. Challenge Valuation - a recent initiative

To improve transparency in the valuation process, Challenge Valuation (CV) has been introduced.

After the re-valuation, if the student is not satisfied with the marks awarded, the Examination Branch has given the opportunity to the student to apply for **CV**. In this process, examiner appointed by Controller of Examinations and student Parent College appointed faculty will participate in the challenge valuation in CE office. Initially they do independent valuation and then the discussion will follow to finalize the marks to be awarded. Student will also be allowed to go through the script and awarded marks and seeks clarification from evaluators regarding marks being awarded. A file compiled with challenge valuation awarded marks are submitted for approval before publishing of the result.

This academic year 0.0004% have applied for challenge valuation

3.7 Student Services

After the completion of the course, the students are scattered all over the world for different purposes, JNTUH Exam branch upgrades itself to meet the requirements of the students and also issue the certificates through online/offline services which will reach the students through by post or by hand within short time.
